## Getting Ahead And Staying Ahead

Our 8th Getting Ahead class started January 11, 2025 and ended April 12, 2025!

To date 65 investigators have graduated from Getting Ahead classes. Graduation rate is 72%



# DONEGAL POWER PACKS

This year Donegal Power Packs distributed 88 packs weekly. The packs helped feed, 184 children, 153 adults, and 17 seniors. Each pack contains a meal that amounts to about 7 lbs of food each (cost is about \$6 a bag). This year the Donegal Power Packs also piloted a choice pantry, that allowed families to come and pick items for a meal for their family.

This choice pantry option was provided for families that may not be able to access the packs through school distributuion. Ten families were served through this program. In the past 2 years the number of individuals served increased by 20% and the cost of food provided increased by 30%.





The Donegal Presbyterian garden space was added in 2024. Of the 3.6 acres that were donated, we utilized one acre. This yielded 1,000 lbs. of produce that was given away to Power Packs, the Senior Apartments, and local food banks.

The Mount Joy Mennonite Church gardens is where all the bulk vegetables are grown such as potatoes, carrots, and beets.



Florin Church continues to host an asparagus patch, heirloom tomatoes, and personal garden plots.

For 2025, we plan to double the size of the used space at Donegal Presbyterian.

# Stories of impact: this year's story is about how Stephanie is reaching her goals.

Friends of Donegal met Steph when she registered for the 2nd Getting Ahead class. Steph graduated from Getting Ahead in April 2022.

Steph says:

In a just gettin' by world I had a connection to Friends of Donegal that I didn't know existed: Christina. She connected me to the class when she and Pastor Tom were facilitating.

To describe my mental health model pre-Getting Ahead class I could use one word: CRISIS.

I was in a constant state of crisis, putting out fires daily.

My life since completing Getting Ahead has improved.

When a crisis approaches I stop, and pause. I pray and pay attention to my heart rate. I stop and attend to the immediate need and then ask for help or sometimes just guidance.

I developed three (3) goals:

- Pay off my car,
- Get my bachelors degree,
- Buy a house.

I have paid off my van. I got my bachelor's degree, and have even started on my Master's in Social Work. I completed the paperwork for a USDA home loan.

One word to someone considering attending the Getting Ahead classes......GO!!!
